

## Corner Canyon Summer Driver Education

### Summer 2013 Proposal

#### Registration/Fee:

Driver Education Fee	\$95.00
Summer School Fee	<u>\$45.00</u>
Total	\$140.00

Corner Canyon students who turn 16 before December 31, 2013 are eligible to register for Summer Driver Education. Registration and fee payment must be completed in person before the first day of class. It is recommended you secure your spot in a Section early, classes will fill quickly. Registration forms and payment must be made in the main office of CCHS. Please keep a copy of your receipt and bring it with you to the first day of class.

#### Advantages of Corner Canyon Summer Driver Education Program

- Students will earn a Certificate of Completion which will include their written test score and driving test score. No additional testing at the DMV is required.
- Student will earn ¼ elective credit which can be applied toward graduation. Completing summer driver ed. gives students more flexibility in planning their school schedules and allows students to take more electives during the school year.
- The fees are significantly lower than commercial driver education programs.
- Multiple classroom dates are offered to accommodate students' busy summer schedules.

#### REQUIREMENTS TO PASS THE CLASS AND RECEIVE A COMPLETION CERTIFICATE

Classroom Sessions: 27 hours of seat time are required to qualify for a Utah Driver License. In order to provide flexibility and to accommodate busy summer schedules, multiple classroom sections will be offered.

Classes will be 3 hours each day during the section. Two classroom sessions will be offered each day. One from 6:00- 9:00 am (AM session) and one from 11:00 a.m.- 2:00 pm (PM session). Students may choose which session (AM or PM) to attend each day, but attendance at one of the daily sessions is mandatory. Due to the seat time requirements mandated by the State of Utah, students must attend a minimum of 27 hours in the classroom. In order to accommodate illness and/or emergencies, one make-up session is scheduled per section. **Students will only be allowed to miss and make-up one class session during the section.** In the event that a student misses a session, the time must be made up on the make-up day assigned to that section. Students who miss 2 or more classes during the session will receive a failing grade. Refunds will not be issued for students who fail to meet the attendance requirements. **Students must earn a minimum of 70% class average to receive credit for the course.**

- Section 1:** June 10 – 14, June 17-20 (Make up session June 21)
- Section 2:** July 1-3, July 8-10, July 15-17 (Make up session July 22)
- Section 3:** July 29- August 2, August 5-8 (Make up session August 9)

Driving Range: 6 hours of behind- the- wheel training on the student driving range. Range sessions do not have to be completed by the end of the classroom instruction. Range times will be offered throughout the summer, including Saturdays. Students will sign up for 3 two-hour range sessions that fit their schedule. It is important that students keep their commitment to complete range driving on the days and times they sign up for. Don't sign up for a slot unless you are sure you can attend. **Priority for range times will be given to students according to the eligibility date on their Learner's Permit.** Students may not sign up for more than one range session (2 hours) per day.

Road Driving and Road Test: Students will complete 6 hours of road driving, 3 hours of behind –the- wheel driving and 3 hours of observation. The road test will be given by the instructor at the end of the last driving session. Road driving times will be scheduled by the instructor. **Priority for road drive and road test times will be given according to the eligibility date on a student's Learner Permit.**

Learner Permits: Learner Permits can be obtained from the Drive License Division at the age of 15. To receive a 50 question test, pay a \$15 fee, pass a health questionnaire, pas a vision test, provide your original birth certificate and Social Security card, and show two forms of ID proving that you reside in Utah (i.e. Property Tax Notice, Utility Bill, etc.) The State of Utah requires that applicant under the age of 18 hold a Learner Permit for six months prior to receiving their driver license. **It is highly recommended that you get your learner permit before the first day of class. Road driving and road test times cannot be scheduled if students do not have a valid permit.**
